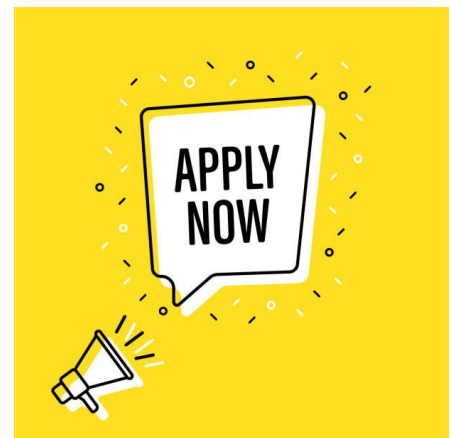
MOBILE FINANCIAL AID

East Los Angeles College offers a mobile, personalized process that makes everything about navigating financial aid easier. At elac.verifymyfafsa.com you can complete pending financial aid tasks online, with secure document upload from any device, and e-sign capabilities. After submitting your FAFSA, or CA Dream Act Application create an account to enjoy the benefits. For Dream Act applicants, please use your Dream Act ID number (000 number) assigned instead of SSN.

FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION

If you need financial assistance to pay for college, don't miss out! Students attending East Los Angeles College during summer 2022 through Spring 2023, should submit the 2022-2023 FAFSA with the ELAC school code **001222**, and ensure their social security number is on file with the Office of Admissions and Records. If you have met the AB540 eligibility criteria with the Office of Admissions and Records, submit the 2022-2023 California Dream Act Application (CADAA) and include the ELAC school code **02226000**.

Still haven't submitted your application for 2021- 2022? It's not too late! Students who were enrolled between summer 2021 and spring 2022 should submit the 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA as soon as possible. You may be eligible for the California College Promise Grant (CCPG) tuition fee waiver and additional financial aid.



2022-2023 CAL GRANT PRIORITY DEADLINE

March 2 is a very important date. It is the Cal Grant application deadline for High School Entitlement Award. For many universities or community colleges, this date is also mark as their priority funding for their limited institution financial aid funds. It is highly recommended that you complete your financial aid application as early as possible to allow you to qualify for as much funding as possible. Check with the college that you are applying for their priority application deadline.

CADAA FAQ'S

There are common misconceptions about the CA Dream Act application which may prevent undocumented students from taking advantage of many available financial aid opportunities. To assist students in making the best decisions to fund their education, CSAC has provided a resource that discusses the most frequently asked questions (FAQ'S) from students and parents, and offers clear, reliable answers.

As an undocumented student, if you have ever wondered what types of financial aid you are eligible for, is it safe to fill out the CADAA, what application do you submit if you have a special designation social security card, or if your parent's citizenship status affects your Dream Act eligibility, you are not alone. CHAFEE GRANT

The Chafee Grant provides California foster youth up to \$5,000 per year at an eligible California or out of state college. Student must be a current or former foster youth who was a ward of the court, living in foster care, for at least one day between the ages of 16 and 18, have not reached age 26 as of July 1 of the award year, and have not participated in the program for more than 5 years (whether or not consecutive).
