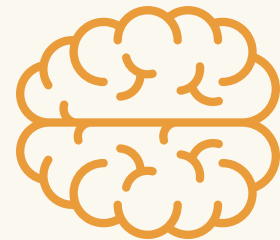

Copy selected text or items.

Ctrl + X

Cut selected text or items.

Ctrl + V

Paste copied or cut text or items.

Ctrl + Z

Undo the last action.

Ctrl + A

Select all items in a document or window.

Alt + Tab

Switch between open applications.

Windows Key + D

Show or hide the desktop.

Windows Key + L

Lock your computer.

Ctrl + N

Open a new window in browsers or file explorers.

Ctrl + W

Close the current window or tab.

Ctrl + F

Open the search bar to find text within documents or web pages.

Windows Key + E

Open File Explorer.

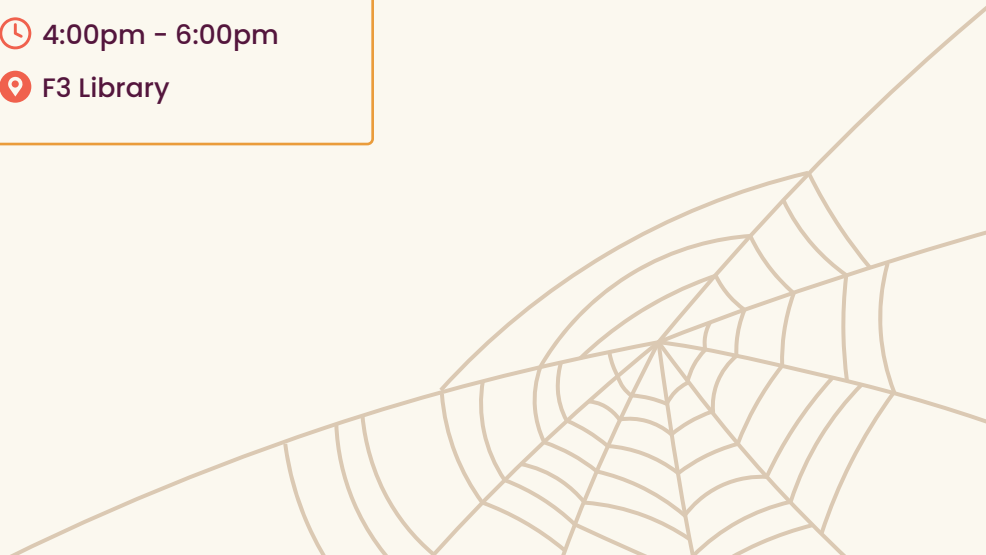
