ABOUT LACCD ENROLLMENT

LACCD is the largest community college district in California and among the largest in the nation. Currently, LACCD annually enrolls nearly 194,000 full- and part-time students at its nine colleges.

LOS ANGELES COLLEGE PROMISE

The student success Promise Program provides two full years of free tuition, free laptop computers, priority registration, and access to educational and financial aid counseling for first-time, full-time students who enroll in the program. Close to 36,000 students enrolled and nearly 8,000 students graduated with Associate degree since the program first began in 2017.

DIVERSITY

LACCD is a leading educator in California for Latinx and African-American students, including DACA students. The District's nine colleges combined educate more Latinx and African-American students than the University of California system. All nine colleges are designated as Hispanic Serving Institutions.



ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

FOR 2022-2023, THE DISTRICT CONFERRED NEARLY 35,000 AWARDS, including two-year degrees and certificates.

OVER 5,000 OF THOSE AWARDS WERE TRANSFER DEGREES.

In addition, in this year, West Los Angeles College was the highest producing community college in California for four-year bachelor's degrees.

In 2022-2023, 58 students earned their bachelor's in Dental Hygiene, a **100-PERCENT INCREASE** over the 29 students who were the first-ever in the District to receive similar bachelor's degrees in 2018.

FINANCIAL AID

More than half of all LACCD students report their incomes at near or below the poverty line. During the 2022-2023 Academic Year, LACCD distributed nearly \$266M in financial aid awards, not including student loans. Research shows that an education at LACCD's colleges is an important source of economic stability and upward mobility for some of the neediest residents of Los Angeles County. LACCD graduates with an associate degree earn, on average, 33% percent more than persons who only have a high school diploma.

NURSING

Currently, 7 out of 9 colleges within LACCD offer Associate of Science degrees in Nursing. In the 2022-2023 academic year, a total of 293 awards were granted in this field. A very high percentage of LACCD graduates pass the California Board of Registered Nursing licensing exam the first time.

VETERANS

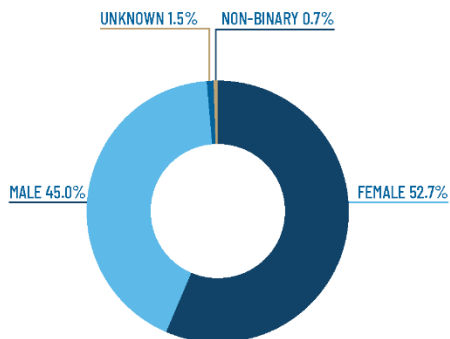
LACCD proudly serves and welcomes all U.S. Veterans. During the 2022-2023 Academic Year, our colleges awarded 254 Associate degrees to Veterans and 221 certificates. Total enrollment of Veterans at the nine colleges is about 2,450.

APPRENTICESHIP & UNION EMPLOYER TRAINING

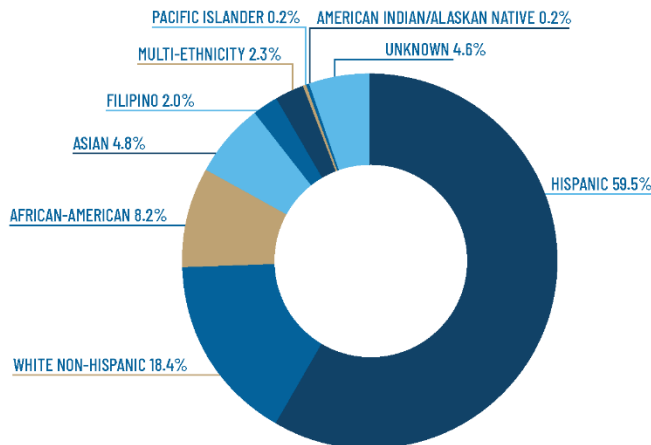

Established in 1929, Los Angeles City College is one of the oldest of the California Community Colleges. Located in the heart of Hollywood, LACC provides a dynamic, innovative learning environment offering more than 100 vocational and professional programs, including degrees, transfer programs, and certificates to more than 18,000 students. In the past decade, a total of 6,651 students have transferred to four-year colleges and universities, including 4,040 students attending Cal State universities and 1,086 students transferring to UC campuses. Los Angeles City College is home to one of the most vibrant and diverse campuses in the country. The campus provides a wide range of professional and vocational programs at a fraction of the cost of state and private colleges. LACC provides students and adult learners with vital pathways to more advanced education and enhanced employment.

ELAC offers a multidisciplinary approach to the study of theater. Students are encouraged to attend classes while participating in our productions to better understand all aspects of the craft. Our two theaters (proscenium and blackbox), costume shop, scene shop, and classrooms offer access to state-of-the-art equipment. Students interested in technical theater will have the opportunity to train on our fabric printer, CNC router, laser cutter, and an array of industry-standard equipment.

West Los Angeles College, named a national Aspen 150 top community college for 2023, provides high-quality degree and certificate programs through both online and in-person instruction. West is also distinguished as one of only 15 California community colleges authorized to offer a bachelor's degree (Dental Hygiene). With a focus on climate change as an issue of social justice, West is the only community college in the region to offer an Associate Degree in Climate Change & Environmental Studies and was the driving force behind the establishment of the California Center for Climate Change Education. Located minutes from Downtown Culver City, often described as one of the nation's top creative centers, West has a close relationship with local studios via a unique program that prepares students for behind-the-scenes film/TV production careers such as grip or set decorator. West's educational offerings are complemented by a wooded hillside setting with panoramic views extending from Playa del Rey to Century City.

Get career-ready at Los Angeles Mission College! Mission's robust STEM department offers stackable certificates leading to an Associate Degree in Biotechnology. Students have received employment offers before completing the program, leading to full-time jobs at Cedars Sinai, T-Cure, Griffons Biological, Takeda Pharmaceuticals, PharmaVite, and ThermoFisher. Our award-winning Culinary Arts Institute offers two associate degrees and eight certificates. Similar culinary programs are available at Harbor and Trade-Tech colleges.

Love animals? Then Pierce's Registered Veterinary Technician program, a board-certified program, is the career pathway for you! This career education program in modern veterinary medicine techniques has a 100% completion rate and a 90% employment rate, with many of our students securing well-paying jobs even before graduating.

Southwest's Phlebotomy Technician I program is a 96-hour, basic and advanced classroom training featuring 40 hours of actual clinical training. The popular program averages about 30 students per cohort and prepares them for state licensing exams. Our Phlebotomist graduates go on to in-demand jobs at hospitals, clinics, and other medical facilities, drawing blood from patients for medical testing.

Fashion takes center stage at Trade-Tech where haute couture students go on to careers in the dynamic clothing industry. Students learn the fundamental skills and techniques in garment creation using the latest industry software and design ideas. In 2019, the program received national "Pathway of the Year" honors and Nike hired seven students after they completed all-expenses-paid internships.



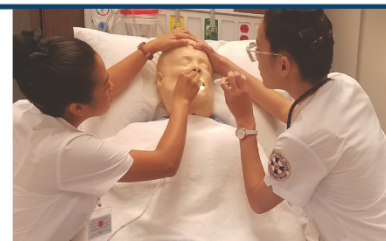

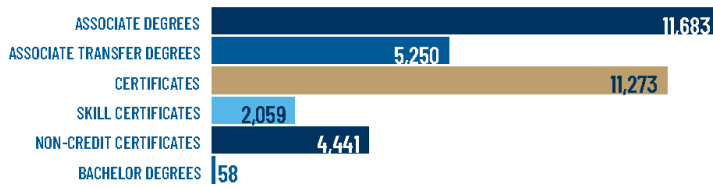

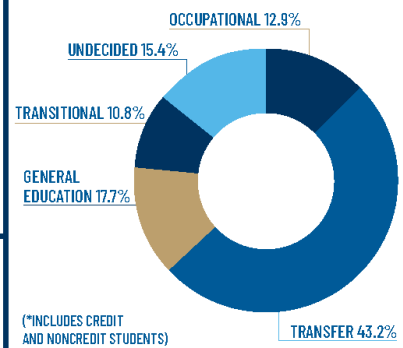




DEGREES & CERTIFICATES AWARDED 2022-2023



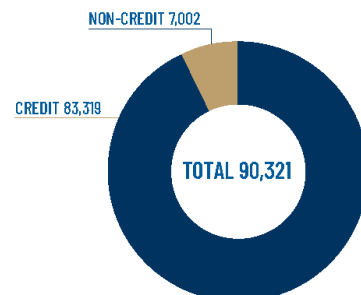
STUDENTS* BY EDUCATIONAL GOAL: (FALL 2023)
