## ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (LACCD AP 4100) (2023-2024)

**Unit Requirement:** Minimum 60 semester units of course credit in a selected curriculum with at least 18 semester units of study in a major or area of emphasis and at least 18 semester units of study in general education.

**Scholarship Requirements:** A "C" (2.0) grade average or higher in all degree applicable coursework in the curriculum upon which the degree is based including external degree applicable coursework used to meet the degree requirements.

**Residency Requirement:** Completion of at least 12 units at the college conferring the degree.

**Additional Requirement:** The associate degree also requires demonstrated competence in reading, written expression, mathematics and satisfactory completion of an ethnic studies course.

### A. Reading and Writing Expression

1. Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher Freshman Composition from any California Community College or the equivalent from any United States regionally accredited institution with a grade of C- or higher.
2. Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher a California Community College course that meets the California State University General Education Breadth (CSUGE Breadth) requirement in Area A2: Written Communication and/or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) in Area 1A: English Composition.
3. Achieved a satisfactory score on an external examination (such as, but not limited to an Advanced Placement Exam) as specified in LACCD Administrative Procedures.

### B. Mathematics

1. Verification of passing with a grade of C- or higher, or Credit/Pass/Satisfactory if equivalent to a grade of C- or higher per sending institution's transcript key, a mathematics course at or above the level of the course typically known as Intermediate Algebra or the equivalent from any United States regionally accredited secondary or post-secondary institution.
2. Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher a California Community College course that meets the California State University General Education Breadth (CSU GE Breadth) requirement in Area B4: Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning and/or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) in Area 2A: Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning.
3. Achieving a satisfactory score (using a DAS-approved scoring-method) on a DAS-approved District Mathematics Competency examination.
4. Achieved a satisfactory score on an external examination (AP/CLEP/IB) as specified in LACCD Administrative Procedures

**C. Ethnic Studies Graduation Requirement:** Students enrolling for the first time at an LACCD College in the fall 2023 term or later (or a returning student) must complete one ethnic studies course to graduate with an Associate Degree.

Complete one course in Ethnic Studies below. Course may double-count in an LACCD GE area.

**AFRO**African **AMERICAN** Studies 004, 005, **HISTORY** 041, 042

**OR**

Complete a California Community College course approved to meet an ethnic studies area in any intersegmental general education pattern.

**OR**

Verification of passing with a grade of C or P or higher a transfer-level course in ethnic studies from any California Community College or the equivalent from any United States regionally accredited institution with a grade of C- or higher, or Credit/Pass/Satisfactory if equivalent to a grade of C- or higher per the sending institution's transcript key. This requirement may be satisfied by obtaining a satisfactory grade in a course in ethnic studies taught in or on behalf of other departments and disciplines.

**Major Requirements:** Per Title 5 and AP 4100, a minimum of 18 units in a single or related field must be completed to graduate. For students entering fall 2009 or after, each course counted towards the major or area of emphasis requirement must be completed with a C grade or better.

**General Education Requirements:** Students may satisfy their associate degree general education requirements by completing either the LAHC G.E. pattern, IGETC, CSU GE-Breadth, IGETC for STEM, CSU GE for STEM, an associate degree from a U.S. regionally accredited institution (Students must meet current LACCD math and English competency), or a bachelor's degree or higher.

**Double Count:** Courses listed in more than one subject area may only be applied once, i.e., you may only use it one general education area (exceptions for E1 and E2).
