This is a course in reading and writing designed to strengthen the student's basic communication skills, including grammar, spelling, punctuation, and sentence construction. Greatest emphasis is placed on the writing of competent paragraphs and short essays.

Develops proficiency in college-level reading and writing through the application of the principles of rhetoric, argument, and critical thinking. Students will write expository essays based on college-level readings. Emphasis is placed on the research paper. This course requires the writing of a minimum of 6000 words in essays and a research paper.

**NOTE:** This is the first freshman composition course that meets requirements for the BA at four-year colleges and universities, comprising intensive reading, writing of essays, term papers, the study of style, methods of discourse, logic, and documentation.

Students interpret the spatial patterns using maps produced from Geographic Information System (GIS), Global Positioning System (GPS), and satellite imagery.

Explores the concepts of algebra, including signed numbers, exponents, linear equations, graphs, and quadratic equations. It also contains techniques for interpreting and solving verbal programs related to the above topics.
