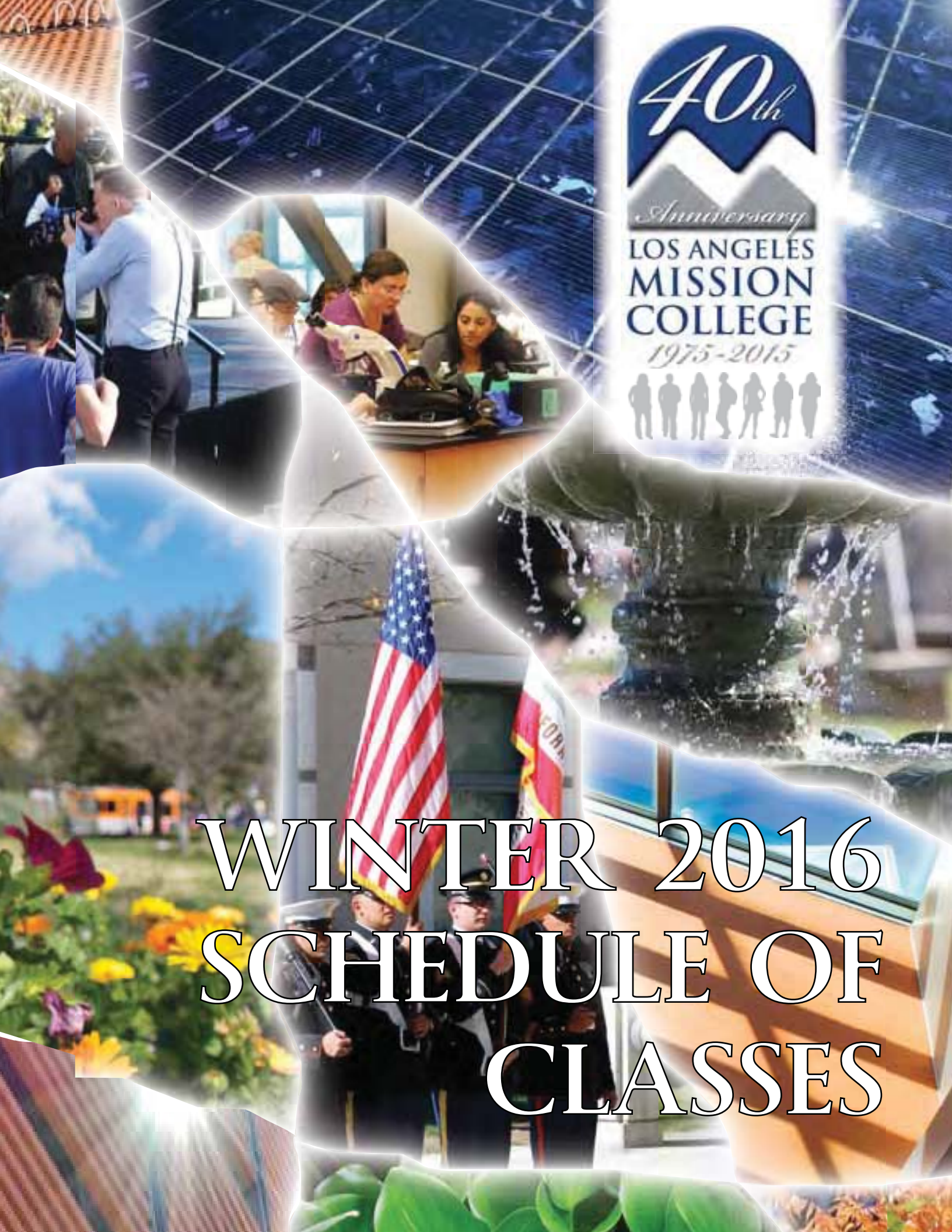

Integration of seasonality, grading, post-harvest handling and environmental impacts. Emphasis is on care, watering, fertilizer and weed control of the Organic Herb & Farm Garden by the Culinary Arts Institute and making sure that all products used in the Culinary Arts Institute Bldg. Follows green standards as described by LEED Platinum Certification.

This is a course in reading and writing designed to strengthen the student's basic communication skills, including grammar, spelling, punctuation, and sentence construction. Greatest emphasis is placed on the writing of competent paragraphs and short essays.

**Prerequisite:** English 28 or ESL 8 with a grade of 'C' or better, or appropriate skill level demonstrated through the English assessment process, or by permit. Develops proficiency in college-level reading and writing through the application of the principles of rhetoric, argument, and critical thinking. Students will write expository essays based on college-level readings. Emphasis is placed on the research paper. This course requires the writing of a minimum of 6000 words in essays and a research paper.

NOTE: This is the first freshman composition course that meets requirements for the BA at four-year colleges and universities, comprising intensive reading, writing of essays, term papers, the study of style, methods of discourse, logic, and documentation.
